



Outpatient Surgery Center of Central Florida has been closely following the spread of COVID-19 or Corona-virus. The health and safety of our patients is our top priority. Our Administrator/Director of Nursing not only is trained in Infection Control that Meets the CMS requirements for infection control in an Ambulatory Surgery Center, but also, is in coordination with the Department of Health Sumter County to ensure your safety in our facility.

This facility has cleaning practices that have always exceeded Center for Disease Control and Prevention or the CDC, and the World Health Organization or WHO guidelines. Our Facility practices comprehensive cleaning and sanitation protocols. We require all anyone in our building to wear a face mask and to properly social distance. This facility also practices a cleaning technique called terminal cleaning designed for Healthcare Operating Rooms. Terminal cleaning is defined as : "a method used in healthcare environments to control and remove the spread of infections." The cleaning supplies used have been proven to kill COVID-19. We have special antimicrobial wax on our floors to stop any spread of microbes. The HVAC system is designed to have over 30 air exchanges per hour. The air in this facility is filtered through two sets of hospital grade filter systems, and to take it a step further we even have a plasma UV lights in our HVAC to ensure nothing gets past our filtration. Our building maintains positive pressure meaning air is pushed out of our building in a way to eliminate any potential bacterial or virus from spreading in this facility.

Any Outpatient Surgery Center employee that is experiencing flu-like symptoms are required to stay home, and all non essential employees are asked to work from home.

We are limiting travel of our employees and business partners. In it's place we are increasing the use of remote communication technologies.

We are confident that we are taking appropriate steps to keep our patients, employees, and our physicians safe. We always put our patients and associates first, that commitment has never been more important. Our team is always working hard to maintain a safe environment to support your health and safety that exceeds the CDC and WHO's guidelines.
